

Overview of March

During this period, I got the opportunity to observe and be part of discussions related to regulatory processes, including matters connected to the Standards of Performance (SOP). These interactions helped me understand how such regulations are reviewed and amended through structured discussions and hearings. I was also involved in meetings regarding the development of a truing-up AI system in collaboration with institutions like XIME and Mar Baselios College, which gave me an idea of how technology is being integrated into regulatory practices.

One of the most valuable experiences during the month was attending review meetings conducted at the Electrical Divisions of Chathanoor, Pallom, and Tirurangadi. These visits gave me practical exposure to compliance audits at the field level. I was able to understand how regulations and standards are implemented in real situations, how performance is evaluated, and how gaps are identified and addressed. This helped me connect theoretical knowledge with actual practices followed in different divisions.

A major part of my work involved documentation and report preparation. I worked on compiling the third quarterly report of CGRF and the Ombudsman and also contributed to preparing a consolidated annual report covering multiple financial years. Through this, I learned how large volumes of information are structured into formal reports. I was also involved in drafting notes and preparing reply letters using the E-file system, which improved my understanding of official communication procedures. In addition, I continued working on website-related tasks, which added to my technical exposure.

At the same time, I focused on strengthening my understanding of the legal and technical aspects of the electricity sector. Studying provisions such as Section 142 of the Electricity Act helped me understand compliance mechanisms and penalties, giving me a clearer idea of how regulations are enforced in practice.

Alongside my office work, I maintained consistency in self-learning. I continued reading *A Short History of Nearly Everything*, where I explored advanced scientific topics including the Special Theory of Relativity, which helped me develop a broader perspective beyond my core subject. I also completed reading *Stay Hungry Stay Foolish*, which gave me insights into the journeys, struggles, and achievements of entrepreneurs, and motivated me to think more openly about career paths and personal growth. In addition, I started reading *The Richest Man in Babylon*, through which I learned important financial principles and life lessons, and I also planned to represent these ideas in the form of a mind map for better understanding.

I also worked on writing an essay on the topic "Technological and Economic Development in Taiwan for the Past 50 Years." This helped me understand how a country can transform through consistent policy decisions, technological

advancement, and economic planning. It gave me a broader perspective on development and the importance of innovation and governance in shaping a nation's growth.

In terms of language improvement, I regularly practiced English grammar using Wren and Martin, completing multiple chapters and exercises throughout the month. I completed upto chapter 21 of this book. This helped me improve my understanding of sentence structure, usage, and overall communication skills, which I realized are essential in professional environments.

Overall, March was a productive and well-balanced month for me. I was able to gain practical exposure to regulatory processes, especially through review meetings and compliance audits, while also improving my documentation, communication, and technical understanding.
