The Lord's Prayer

First Stanza

"Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven."

Themes: Eternal decree, holiness, reverence, kingdom, community, covenantal agreement

Holiness, Reverence, Kingdom, Covenant, Community

Second Stanza

"Give us this day our daily bread."

Themes: Provision, heavenly manna (Spirit, Word of God), justification, adoption, sanctification

Provision, Justification, Adoption, Sanctification

Third Stanza

"Forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors."

Themes: Forgiveness, release, freedom, deliverance, repentance, perseverance, assurance

Forgiveness, Release, Freedom, Deliverance, Repentance

Perseverance

Fourth Stanza

"Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil."

Themes: Suppressing the will, wrestling with self (the greatest battle), deliverance from the evil one (potentially the self)

Self-Suppression, Wrestling, Deliverance, Battle

The Beatitudes (Matthew 5:3-12)

First Beatitude

"Blessed are the poor in spirit"

Themes: Submitting your spirit, adoption, engraving into God's kingdom

Submission, Adoption, Engrafting

Second Beatitude

"Blessed are those who mourn"

Themes: Mourning, separation, receiving acceptance

Mourning, Separation, Acceptance

Third Beatitude

"Blessed are the meek"

Themes: Meekness, walking, fullness

Meekness, Walking, Fullness

Fourth Beatitude

"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness"

Themes: Hunger, thirst for righteousness and God, satisfaction, flourishing, nourishment

Hunger, Thirst, Satisfied, Flourishing

Fifth Beatitude

"Blessed are the merciful"

Themes: Mercy, compassion, gift of free grace (unworthy of)

Mercy, Compassion, Grace, Unworthy

Sixth Beatitude

"Blessed are the pure in heart"

Themes: Pure in heart, desire His presence, beholding Him, seeing Him, gentle embrace from a loved one

Purity, Desire, Beholding, Presence

Seventh Beatitude

"Blessed are the peacemakers"

Themes: Peacemakers, way-makers, Kingdom builders

Peacemaking, Way-Making, Kingdom Building

Eighth Beatitude

"Blessed are those persecuted for righteousness' sake"

Themes: Wrestlers for the kingdom, owning your voice, your place in the tribe

Wrestling, Voice, Tribe, Identity

Extracted Metrics: Core Attributes of Christian Formation

Measurable indicators derived from both frameworks for tracking spiritual transformation

1. Covenant Alignment (Lord's Prayer 1st / Beatitudes 1st)

Am I submitting my spirit to God's kingdom, or resisting His will? Do I see myself as adopted into His family, or still an outsider?

2. Dependence Awareness (Lord's Prayer 2nd / Beatitudes 4th)

Do I recognize my daily need for spiritual provision (Word, Spirit)? Am I hungry and thirsty for righteousness, or spiritually complacent?

3. Forgiveness Practice (Lord's Prayer 3rd / Beatitudes 5th)

Am I releasing debts and receiving freedom through repentance? Do I extend mercy and compassion to others as grace has been given to me?

4. Self-Confrontation (Lord's Prayer 4th / Beatitudes 2nd-3rd)

Am I wrestling with my own will and recognizing the enemy within (self)? Do I mourn my separation from God and walk in meekness (power under control)?

5. Presence Pursuit (Beatitudes 6th / Lord's Prayer 1st)

Is my heart becoming pure in its desire for God alone? Do I behold Him, or am I distracted by lesser things? Am I experiencing the gentle embrace of intimacy?

6. Kingdom Contribution (Beatitudes 7th-8th / Lord's Prayer 1st)

Am I a peacemaker and way-maker in my community? Do I wrestle for the kingdom, owning my voice and place in the tribe?
