Section 3: Mission/Vision

The Parker Artists Guild (PAG) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization based in Parker, Colorado. Founded in 2000, the core mission of the Parker Artists Guild is to promote local artists, showcase original artwork, provide educational opportunities, and celebrate visual arts achievements throughout Parker and the southeast Denver metropolitan area.

The Parker Artists Guild has evolved into an active organization representing a wide range of artistic disciplines with members that range from emerging artists to experienced professionals. Member events such as monthly meetings, educational programs, and social gatherings directly contribute to the PAG overall mission. Year-round art shows, area business exhibitions, and a large annual art festival are strategically aligned to overall PAG objectives.

Section 4: Summary of Accomplishments

The Parker Artists Guild hosted year-round member events to bring our community together through monthly meetings, creative opportunities, and social gatherings that support connection, learning, and shared inspiration. The Guild managed several art shows, presented prize money and awards, and offered training sessions to benefit a growing PAG membership.

Monthly Member Meeting: Member meetings were held on the third Wednesday of each month at the Schoolhouse on Mainstreet. These gatherings offer time to connect with fellow artists, enjoy presentations or demonstrations, and stay informed about upcoming events and opportunities at the Parker Artists Guild. Annual membership dues range from \$25 to \$85 for Youth, Individual, Family, and Volunteer Buyout options.

Donations: PAG donated \$540 and approximately \$200 in art supplies to "Covered Colorado," a local organization providing care and healing for survivors of sex trafficking.

Schoolhouse Gallery: The Parker Artists Guild managed six art displays offered year-round at the Schoolhouse at Mainstreet (19650 E. Main Street, Parker, CO 80138). Additionally, PAG hosted the **National Arts Program**, an exhibit designed to give all artists, at all skill levels, an uninhibited opportunity to showcase their work in a professional manner and compete for cash prizes. The show is open to all artists from age five to adult professionals that live within a 50-mile radius of Parker, Colorado.

Art in the Park: The Parker Artists Guild, in partnership with Parker Arts, planned and managed the Art in the Park art show held August 30 – 31, 2025 at O'Brien Park in Parker, Colorado. In addition to original art featured by local and PAG artists, there was live music, food trucks, a silent auction, and art-related activities for all ages. Over 60 artists offered their artwork for sale, drawing thousands of visitors from the community and benefiting from an overall sales amount of over \$90,000. Nearly 40 volunteers and a dedicated planning team was responsible for this enormous accomplishment.

- The income and expense information presented in the first two tables represents data analyzed from the PAG bank account. The detailed categories are shown in the table to the right. The Net Income was \$751.29.
- Flipcause has failed to pay all the net income owed to PAG, hence the loss shown under 2025 income. To include payments owed PAG from 2024, it is determined Flipcause owes PAG a total of **\$9,010.11**. PAG is part of a Class Action Lawsuit against Flipcause.
- A separate budget for Art in the Park is available on the following page. This table represents an isolated budget developed during event planning. The expense total does not include entertainment costs (which were reimbursed) and miscellaneous expenses such as extra copies, water, supplies, etc., incurred during the event. Therefore, the total expense will not match the expense categories presented in the tables above. Additionally, since Flipcause has failed to pay all the income owed to PAG, the actual income received may be less than the total income shown.
- The end of year PAG bank balance is \$13,992.85. Of that, \$4,450.00 is allocated to the National Arts Program and there is an outstanding check total of \$311.50. The remaining available balance is \$9,231.35.

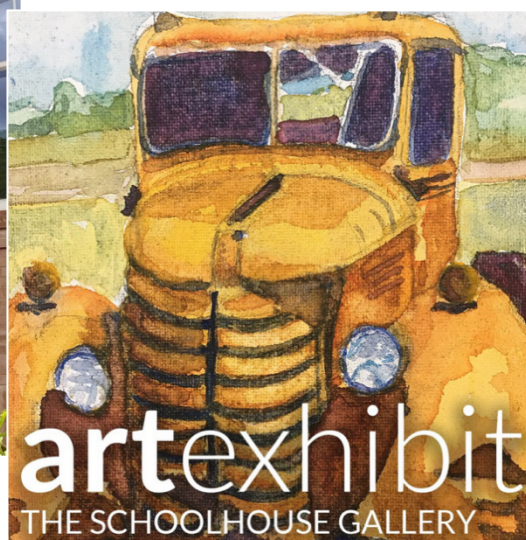
The PAG partnership with Parker Arts was invaluable to the success of Art in the Park. The donations for entertainment, printing, and advertising were greatly appreciated.
