
# Decodable Texts: Short a (CVC Words)

## **Coaching Guide**

**Target Skill:** Short a CVC Words **Genre:** Nonfiction – Personal Recount

#### **Before Reading**

1. Talk about what you do at camp or on a trip

2. Ask: What do you think people do at the beach or in the sand?

3. Ask: What food would you want to pack for a picnic?

#### **During Reading**

- 1. Sounding Out Support: Help your reader blend the sounds slowly, like m-a-t
- 2. Watch for short a words
- 3. Ask: What does Pam do after she gets her mat?
- Prompt: Read with a calm voice until the bug shows up—then add energy!

#### After Reading

- 1. Ask: What things did Pam do at camp?
- 2. Ask: What might Pam do next time so the bug won't wake her up?
- 3. Ask: What did this story remind you of?
- 4. Skill Mastery Prompt: Find 5 short a words and highlight them!
- 5. Fluency Tip: Read it again and change your voice when the bug shows up!

## **Activity Idea**

Draw a camp scene like Pam's and label things with short a words. Write 1 sentence about what Pam might do next.

### **Coaching Tip**

Encourage rereading! Each time your child rereads, they become more confident, fluent, and proud.
