## **Coaching Guide**

**Target Skill:** Beginning Blend *Sk* **Genre:** Realistic Fiction / Nature Walk

High-Frequency Words: the, a, is, on, to, in

#### **Before Reading**

- 1. Remind your reader that *sk* starts words like *skip*, *skid*, and *skate*.
- 2. Have you ever tripped while walking or running? What happened?
- 3. What should you do when someone else falls?

### **During Reading**

- 1. Sounding Out Support: Blend the s and k sounds smoothly in skip and skid
- 2. Ask your child to follow the sequence of events
- 3. What happens after Skip skids?
- 4. Read with excitement, especially on the word Skid!

#### **After Reading**

- 1. Why do you think Stan helped Skip?
- 2. How did the two boys handle the fall?
- 3. Would you keep running or stop for a break?
- 4. Highlight all *sk* words in the story
- 5. Fluency Tip: Try reading the story like you're running and then suddenly stopping!

#### **Activity Idea**

Create a safety guide for nature walks. Include pictures of a rock, a jogger, and a friend helping. Use at least two *sk* words in your labels.
