#### **Before Reading**

1. Let's review -nt and -nd endings like wind and sand.

- 2. Have you ever had wind mess something up?
- 3. What things can the wind blow away?

#### **During Reading**

- Sounding Out Support: Emphasize final blends clearly: /s/ /a/ /n/ /d/ → sand,
   /t/ /e/ /n/ /t/ → tent
- 2. Watch for -nt and -nd words like wind, hand, bent, end
- 3. Where does Tess go to get the tent?
- 4. Read the windy part—"WHISH!"—with a dramatic voice!

### After Reading

- 1. Can you retell what happened first, next, and last?
- 2. What clue in the story tells you Tess learned something?
- 3. Was Tess responsible? Why or why not?
- 4. Skill Mastery: Find 3 -nt words and 3 -nd words
- 5. **Fluency Tip:** Try reading with different voices for Tess and the wind!

### **Activity Idea**

Try a "tent test" experiment. Use paper, straws, or cloth to build a tiny tent and see what happens when you blow on it. What helps it stay in place? Then write or draw one thing you learned from the test.

#### Coaching Tip

Encourage your reader to keep going—even if they need help sounding out some of the trickier blend words. Their effort is building independence!
