Before Reading

1. Remind your reader that *br* is a beginning blend, as in *Brin*, *brave*, and *grab*.
 2. Have you ever made a plan to help someone or something?
 3. What do you know about crabs or traps?
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During Reading

1. Sounding Out Support: Blend /b/ and /r/ clearly when sounding out *br* words
 2. Encourage your reader to follow the sequence of Brin's actions
 3. What is Brin's plan?
 4. Read the final line with a proud and happy voice
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After Reading

1. Why is Brin called brave?
 2. What does she do that shows kindness?
 3. Would you help an animal like Brin did?
 4. Underline all the *br* words in the story
 5. Fluency Tip: Try reading the story like you're telling an exciting adventure!
