
Decodable Texts: All Long Vowel Teams

Before Reading

1. Before Reading

- 2. This story blends long vowel teams like *ea*, *ow*, *ue*, *oa*, and *ee* in words like *clean*, *grow*, *true*, and *steam*.
- 3. What do you use water for every day?
- 4. What do you think happens to water before it comes out of your faucet?

During Reading

- 1. **Sounding Out Support:** Sound out long vowel words like *clean*, *steam*, *smooth*, *true*, and *rain* as you go.
- 2. Watch for vowel team words that explain how water moves and gets cleaned
- 3. What do tools do to clean water?
- 4. Read the final line like it's a call to action—slow, clear, and strong

After Reading

- 1. Retell how water becomes clean and why it matters
- 2. What are three things clean water helps us do?
- 3. What's one way you can help protect water today?
- 4. Skill Check: Highlight six mixed long vowel team words in the story
- 5. **Fluency Tip:** Read it again like you're giving an Earth Day speech to your class

Activity Idea

Draw the clean water path from rain to faucet. Label parts using long vowel team words like "clean," "steam," "grow," or "true." Write one sentence about how clean water helps life.

Coaching Tip
