Coaching Guide

Before Reading

1. We're looking for -lp, -ft, -mp, -nd, and -sk words like *help*, *lift*, *ramp*, *send*, and *task*.
 2. Have you ever seen or read about a rescue team in action?
 3. What kinds of things do helpers do during emergencies?
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During Reading

1. **Sounding Out Support:** Remind your reader to slow down for each blend—especially in words like *send*, *lift*, *task*, and *ramp*
 2. Watch for blend words across all types: *help*, *lift*, *ramp*, *send*, *task*, *map*
 3. What does the team do when someone slips?
 4. Use a strong, confident tone like a team leader giving orders.
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After Reading

1. What kind of tasks does the rescue team do?
 2. Why do you think they need maps and tools?
 3. Would you want to be part of a rescue team? Why or why not?
 4. Skill Mastery: Highlight 5 words with different ending blends
 5. **Fluency Tip:** Read it again like you're training a new helper on the team!
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Activity Idea

Design a "Rescue Team Guide." Draw the team in action and label -lp, -ft, -mp, -nd, and -sk words like *help*, *lift*, *ramp*, *send*, and *task*. Write a line about how the team helps in tough times.
