
Decodable Texts: Long Vowel Teams: ee (seed)

"This story focuses on the 'ee' sound as in 'bee.' Watch for words like 'bees,' 'trees,' and 'seeds' as you read!"



How Bees Help Trees

Did you know that bees help trees grow? When a bee lands on a flower, tiny bits of yellow dust stick to its legs. This dust is called pollen.

As the **bee** moves to the next flower, the pollen falls off. This helps the flower make seeds. Some of those seeds grow into new **trees!**

Without busy bees, it would be hard for many trees to grow. That's why it's important to keep flowers blooming and give bees a safe place to live.

So next time you see a bee, thank it for helping the trees!

Coaching Guide

Before Reading

- 1. Remind them of the target skill: "We're looking for words with the 'ee' sound today!"
- 2. What do you know about how trees grow?
- 3. Have you ever seen a bee on a flower?

During Reading

- Sounding Out Support: Remind kids that 'ee' makes the long /ē/ sound.
 Stretch it out if you get stuck!
- 2. Watch for 'ee' words and say them slowly.
- 3. How do bees help new trees grow?
- 4. Try reading the last sentence with excitement, like you are really thanking the bees!

After Reading

- Can you retell how bees help trees grow?
- 2. Why do you think bees are important to nature?
- 3. How could we make sure bees have safe places to live?
- 4. Skill mastery prompt: "Find and underline 5 'ee' words in the story!"
- 5. **Fluency Tip:** Try reading the last part again like you are teaching a younger child!

Activity Idea

Make a small poster showing why bees are important. Draw flowers, bees, and trees, and write simple facts using 'ee' words. Hang it up to teach others about how bees help the world!

Coaching Tip

Remind your reader that nonfiction stories teach real facts, and it's fun to share what you learn after reading!
