Before Reading

- 2. Encourage noticing words that rhyme or share parts (dig, rig, pit)
- 3. What does the story say a drill can do?
- 4. Read the last line with excitement and energy!

After Reading

- 1. Which digging tool did you like best and why?
- 2. Do you think you could dig with all of those tools?
- 3. What kind of job might use these digging tools?
- 4. Find and read 5 short i words from the story.
- 5. Fluency Tip: Try reading the story like you are teaching someone how to dig!

Activity Idea

Draw three digging tools from the story: a rig, a pick, and a drill. Next to each tool, write a short sentence explaining how it helps dig. For example, "A pick can chip rock." Make sure to use at least one short i word in each sentence.
