

How Plants Grow

Plants grow from seeds that are planted in the ground.

They need sun, water, and care to grow strong.

Some plants grow fast, and some grow slow.

Farmers sow seeds in rows to help them grow in neat lines.

As plants grow, they push below the soil and reach toward the light.

If you watch closely, you'll know when a sprout begins to show!

Before Reading

During Reading

- 1. **Sounding Out Support: Sounding Out Support:** Encourage readers to stretch and blend "ow" words like *grow*, *slow*, and *row* as long o words.
- 2. Watch for target skill words that explain each part of plant growth.
- 3. How do farmers plant seeds so they grow in neat lines?
- 4. Read the final sentence with a sense of excitement and wonder.

After Reading

- 1. Retell the steps a plant takes as it grows.
- 2. Why is it important to care for seeds after you plant them?
- 3. What's something you would plant if you had a garden?
- 4. Skill Check: Highlight six "ow" words in the passage.
- 5. **Fluency Tip:** Read it again with a calm and hopeful voice—like a gardener watching something grow.

Activity Idea

Draw a small plant growing below the ground with roots and above the ground with leaves and light. Label parts using "ow" words like *grow*, *slow*, *row*, *sow*, *below*, or *know*. Write one sentence about how planting takes time.
