How to Draw Animals

Drawing animals is a fun way to show creativity. All you need is a pencil, paper, and a little time to practice.

Start by drawing simple shapes. A circle can be the head, and a small oval can be the paw.

If you want to draw a cat, add two small triangles for the ears and a curvy tail.

Don't worry if it isn't perfect! Every time you draw, you get better. Soon, you'll be able to draw animals that make people say, "Wow!"

After reading the story, have your child point to and slowly sound out each practice word.

- 3. If you could teach someone to draw, what would you show them first?
- 4. Skill mastery prompt: "Find and underline 5 'aw' words in the story!"
- 5. **Fluency Tip:** Try reading the story again like you're teaching a fun art class!
