Coaching Guide

Genre: Nonfiction – Environment

High-Frequency Words: the, and, to, for, can

Before Reading

1. Remind them of the target skill: "We're reading to find words with 'ea' and 'ee' that say the /ē/ sound!"

- 2. Have you ever visited a beach or seen the ocean?
- 3. Why do you think trash can be harmful to sea animals?

During Reading

- 1. **Sounding Out Support:** Remind kids that both 'ea' and 'ee' can say /ē/. Try that sound first when you see those patterns.
- 2. Watch for 'ea' and 'ee' words and stretch them out slowly.
- 3. What happens when people leave trash near the beach?
- 4. Try reading the last part like you're giving an important message to others!

After Reading

- 1. Can you retell how people can help keep the ocean clean?
- 2. Why do you think some people join beach clean-up teams?
- 3. Would you like to help at a beach clean-up? Why or why not?
- 4. Skill mastery prompt: "Find and underline 5 'ea' or 'ee' words in the story!"
- 5. **Fluency Tip:** Try reading the story again like you're giving a speech to protect sea animals!

Activity Idea

Make a poster showing ways to keep the ocean clean. Use at least three 'ea' or 'ee' words on your poster and share your ideas with your family or class.

Coaching Tip

Encourage the reader to slow down and reread sentences when they find tricky words. This helps build fluency and confidence!
