How to Take Care of a Wooden Tool

Wooden tools can last a long time if you take good care of them.

First, look for cracks in the wood. If you see one, it's best to fix it soon.

Use a soft cloth to clean the tool. If the wood looks dry, you can rub it with oil to keep it smooth.

After cleaning, hang the tool on a hook or store it in a dry room.

A clean tool works better and feels good in your hands!

After reading the story, have your child point to and slowly sound out each practice word.

Coaching Guide

Target Skill: "oo" /u/ Sound (as in "book")

Genre: Nonfiction – How-To & Tools

High-Frequency Words: the, and, to, they, their

Before Reading

1. Remind them of the target skill: "We're reading to find 'oo' words that say the /u/ sound, like in 'book' and 'wood.'"
 2. Have you ever cleaned or fixed something to make it last longer?
 3. Why do you think people like to take good care of their tools?
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During Reading

1. **Sounding Out Support:** Remind kids that 'oo' makes the /u/ sound in words like "book." Try that sound first when seeing this pattern.
 2. Watch for 'oo' words and read them clearly.
 3. What should you use to clean a wooden tool?
 4. Try reading the last sentence like you're giving great advice to a friend!
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After Reading

1. Can you retell how to take care of a wooden tool?
 2. Why does a clean tool feel better in your hands?
 3. If you had a special tool, how would you take care of it?
 4. Skill mastery prompt: "Find and underline 5 'oo' words in the story!"
 5. **Fluency Tip:** Try reading the story again like you're teaching someone how to care for tools!
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Activity Idea

Draw a picture of a wooden tool hanging on a hook. Label at least three things using 'oo' words and write a sentence about how to keep it in good shape.

Coaching Tip

Encourage readers to think about how taking care of their belongings—like books and toys—is just like taking care of tools!
