

- 3. Do the pictures help you see the reasons more clearly?

After Reading Discussion Questions

- 1. Why do you think the author believes washing hands is important?
- 2. Can you remember one reason from the story that you agree with?
- 3. What would you say to someone who forgets to wash their hands?

Activity Idea

Have students draw two scenes: one where a child washes hands before lunch and one where they forget. Ask them to label each picture and explain why one choice is healthier using one sentence from the story.
