

Introducing the Text

Before Reading Discussion Questions

During Reading Discussion Questions

- 1. How are buses and bikes different?
- 2. Which one is better for your body?
- 3. Which one carries more people?

After Reading Discussion Questions

- 1. What did both texts teach you about getting from place to place?
- 2. Would you rather ride a bus or a bike? Why?
- What did the illustrations help you understand about each kind of transportation?

Activity Idea

Give students a Venn diagram. In one circle, write "Bus." In the other, write "Bike." Have students draw or write one fact for each and one shared fact in the middle. Let them color it and explain their diagram to a partner.
