
Read the short story and answer each question.



This diagram shows how a bird uses its beak to build a nest step by step.

How a Bird Builds a Nest

Birds build nests to keep their eggs safe and warm.

Most birds use their beaks to gather twigs, grass, and feathers. They look for soft things to line the inside.

Some birds build their nests in trees. Others nest on the ground or even in holes in walls!

The bird puts the materials in a circle shape. Then it presses the middle to make a little bowl.

After the nest is ready, the bird lays its eggs inside. The nest protects the eggs from wind and rain.

Have students draw their own simple diagram showing the steps a bird takes to build a nest. They label each step and write 1–2 sentences explaining how their picture helps someone else understand the process.
