#### **Discussion Questions During Reading**

- 1. What does Max do that upsets Lena?
- 2. How does Lena react to her ruined painting?
- 3. What idea does Lena come up with the next day?

### **Discussion Questions After Reading**

- 1. How did Lena and Max show they cared about each other?
- 2. Why is making a plan important when working with others?
- 3. What does this story teach us about teamwork or forgiveness?

#### **Activity Idea**

Provide students with a large piece of paper and pair them up to create a shared drawing. Before they begin, have them make a "Paintbrush Plan" together by writing or drawing what each person will add. This reinforces problem-solving, planning, and cooperation in a creative, hands-on way.
