

## Why Cactus Plants Don't Need Much Water

Cactus plants live in deserts where it does not rain very often.

Most plants need lots of water. But cactus plants are special.

They have thick stems that hold water like a sponge. They also have sharp spines instead of leaves. These spines help protect the cactus and keep water from drying up.

The roots of a cactus grow wide, not deep. This helps the plant collect rainwater quickly before it disappears into the dry ground.

Because of these special parts, a cactus can survive even in very hot places with almost no rain.

#### **After Reading Discussion Questions**

- 1. How does the picture show you what the cactus does?
- 2. Could you explain the cactus without the diagram? Why or why not?
- 3. What other types of plant diagrams have you seen?

#### **Activity Idea**

Have students draw their own diagram of a cactus and label the parts: stem, spines, roots. Then they write one sentence explaining how one of those parts helps the cactus survive. Share diagrams and display them with captions.
