- 3. What role do the neighbors play as the scenes progress?

After Reading Discussion Questions

- How does each scene contribute to the overall story structure?
- 2. What would the story lose if one of the scenes was removed?
- 3. How did the structure help show Jade's character growth?

Activity Idea

Give students five blank boxes and ask them to write or sketch their own story in five scenes like this one. Then, have them explain how each scene connects to the next and contributes to the overall message.
