Before Reading

- 1. Remind your child that st begins words like Stan, stick, and stuck.
- 2. Have you ever had something get stuck before?
- 3. What are some things you might use to get it unstuck?

During Reading

- 1. Sounding Out Support: Help your reader blend s and t for the st words.
- 2. Ask them what Stan tries before he uses the stick
- 3. What happens when he taps the mat?
- 4. Read with extra emphasis on "Pop!" for fun expression

After Reading

- 1. Why was the sock stuck?
- 2. How did Stan finally get it out?
- 3. What would you have done if you were Stan?
- 4. Circle all the *st* words you can find in the story
- 5. Fluency Tip: Try reading it again with voices—make Stan sound tired, then excited!

Activity Idea

Make a mini comic strip of Stan and his sock. Each panel should show a step in his problem-solving. Use *st* words in the captions or speech bubbles.
