### **Coaching Guide**

**Target Skill:** Long Vowel Team 'aw' (as in "straw")

**Genre:** Fiction – Farm Adventure

**High-Frequency Words:** the, he, and, his, with

#### **Before Reading**

- 1. Remind them of the target skill: "We're looking for 'aw' words that say the /aw/ sound, like in 'straw."
- 2. Have you ever climbed something high and looked around?
- 3. What do you think it would feel like to slide down a big stack of straw?

#### **During Reading**

- 1. **Sounding Out Support:** Remind kids that 'aw' makes the /aw/ sound. Try that sound first when sounding out tricky words.
- 2. Watch for 'aw' words and say them clearly.
- 3. How did Shawn feel after sliding down the straw stack?
- 4. Try reading Grandpa's warning with a serious voice, and Shawn's line with lots of joy!

#### After Reading

- 1. Can you retell what happened when Shawn climbed the straw stack?
- 2. Why did Grandpa smile at the end?
- 3. Would you want to try climbing and sliding down a straw stack? Why or why not?
- 4. Skill mastery prompt: "Find and underline 5 'aw' words in the story!"
- 5. **Fluency Tip:** Try reading the story again like you're on a fun farm adventure!

#### **Activity Idea**

Draw a big stack of straw with Shawn sitting on top. Add at least three labels using 'aw' words and write a short sentence about what he can see from way up high.
