Before Reading

During Reading

- 1. **Sounding Out Support: Sounding Out Support:** Stretch and blend the /oi/ sound in "oi" words like *boil*, *point*, and *noise*. Remind readers to notice how "oi" shows up in the middle of these words.
- 2. Watch for target skill words that show how Milo knows a storm is coming.
- 3. What happened right after Milo pointed at the dark clouds?
- 4. Read the final line with energy and excitement, like the storm was a big surprise!

After Reading

- 1. Retell what happened when Milo saw the storm coming.
- 2. Why did his mom call him inside?
- 3. What is something you would like to watch from inside during a storm?

- 5. **Fluency Tip:** Read it again using a strong, exciting voice—just like you're standing outside and feeling the storm arrive!
