

During Reading

- 1. **Sounding Out Support: Sounding Out Support:** Stretch and blend the /oi/ sound in "oy" words like *boy*, *joy*, and *enjoy*.
- 2. Watch for target skill words that tell how Frank started building as a child.
- 3. What did Frank do when he grew older?
- 4. Read the final line with a proud, happy tone—like you've just made something amazing!

After Reading

- 1. Retell what Frank Lloyd Wright did as a boy and how he became famous.
- 2. Why do you think people still enjoy his buildings today?
- 3. If you could build something special, what would it be and who would enjoy it?
- 4. Skill Check: Highlight six "oy" words in the passage.
