Before Reading

1. Remind them of the target skill: "We're working on words where 'ie' says the long /ē/ sound, like in 'cashier."

- 2. Have you ever visited a small shop or store?
- 3. What would you do if something scary happened and you needed to stay calm?

During Reading

- 1. **Sounding Out Support:** Remind kids that 'ie' can say the /ē/ sound. Try that sound first when sounding out tricky words.
- 2. Watch for 'ie' words and try breaking them into smaller parts.
- 3. How did Nina help keep people calm?
- 4. Try reading the part where Nina presses the alarm with bravery in your voice!

After Reading

- 1. Can you retell what happened when the thief came into the store?
- 2. Why do you think everyone cheered for Nina at the end?
- 3. Do you think Nina was a hero? Why or why not?
- 4. Skill mastery prompt: "Find and underline 5 'ie' words in the story!"
- 5. **Fluency Tip:** Try reading the story again like you're acting out a brave hero scene!

Activity Idea

Draw a bravery award for Nina and write a short note to her using at least three 'ie' words. Share how her bravery made the sweet shop a safe place again.
