### **Coaching Guide**

#### **Before Reading**

- 1. We're focusing on -mp words like *lamp*, *bump*, and *jump*.
- 2. Have you ever been camping or had a funny accident?
- 3. What do you think happens if a lamp falls in the mud?

#### **During Reading**

- 1. **Sounding Out Support:** Help kids blend short vowel sounds with -mp endings:  $/I//a//m//p/ \rightarrow lamp$
- 2. Watch for -mp blend words like camp, stump, and jump
- 3. What did Zed do to the lamp?
- 4. Try reading Zed's funny line with a silly voice!

#### **After Reading**

- 1. What happened at the start, middle, and end of the story?
- 2. Why did Cam and Zed laugh?
- 3. Was this a problem or just a funny moment? Why?
- 4. Skill Mastery: Find 5 words that end in -mp
- 5. **Fluency Tip:** Try reading the story again like a camping skit with voices and motions!

#### **Activity Idea**

Act out the story with simple props! Use a pretend "lamp" and have one student play Cam and another play Zed. Retell the story with movements. Then write or draw what happens next if the lamp needed a fix!
