Coaching Guide

Before Reading

1. Remind them of the target skill: "We're reading to find words where 'ea' and 'ee' say the /ē/ sound!"

- 2. Have you ever seen a bee at work in a garden?
- 3. Why do you think bees love sweet nectar?

During Reading

- 1. **Sounding Out Support:** Remind kids that when they see 'ea' and 'ee,' they should try the long /ē/ sound first.
- 2. Watch for 'ea' and 'ee' words and stretch them out slowly.
- 3. What does a bee do after finding nectar?
- 4. Try reading the last part like you're teaching someone why bees are so helpful!

After Reading

- 1. Can you retell the important jobs that honeybees do?
- 2. Why do people need honeybees to help plants grow?
- 3. Would you like to watch a busy bee working in a garden? Why or why not?
- 4. Skill mastery prompt: "Find and circle 5 'ea' or 'ee' words in the story!"
- 5. **Fluency Tip:** Try reading the story again like you're buzzing from flower to flower!

Activity Idea

Draw a garden full of bright flowers and show where bees would go to find nectar. Label at least three things in your drawing using 'ea' or 'ee' words and share how the bees help the plants grow.
