Coaching Guide

Target Skill: Long Vowel Team 'ie' (as in "chief")

Genre: Fiction – Fantasy Adventure

High-Frequency Words: the, they, to, and, away

Before Reading

1. Remind them of the target skill: "We're working on words where 'ie' says the long /ē/ sound, like in 'chief."

- 2. Have you ever heard a story about hidden treasure or magic caves?
- 3. What kind of animal do you think would make a good tiny guard?

During Reading

- 1. **Sounding Out Support:** Remind kids to try the long /ē/ sound when they see 'ie.' Stretch the vowel sounds carefully.
- 2. Watch for 'ie' words and sound them out slowly.
- 3. What did the kids see guarding the cave?
- 4. Try reading the line where Mia whispers—make your voice soft and mysterious!

After Reading

- 1. Can you retell what happened when the kids found the cave?
- 2. Why do you think the kids decided to leave the cave instead of exploring?
- 3. Do you think the magical shield was real? Why or why not?
- 4. Skill mastery prompt: "Find and circle 5 'ie' words in the story!"
- 5. **Fluency Tip:** Try reading the story again like you're telling a spooky campfire story!

Activity Idea

Create a drawing of the magical shield and its tiny squirrel guard. Add fun details like sparkling gems on the shield and tiny armor pieces on the squirrel. Write a short description using at least three 'ie' words to explain how the shield works.
