### **Coaching Guide**

#### **Before Reading**

1. Remind them of the target skill: "We're looking for 'ie' words that say the long /ī/ sound, like in 'tie.'"

- 2. Have you ever had to dress up for something special?
- 3. What would you do if you lost something really important?

#### **During Reading**

- 1. **Sounding Out Support:** Remind kids that 'ie' often says /ī/ in words like 'tie.' Try that sound first when you see 'ie.'
- 2. Watch for 'ie' words and sound them out carefully.
- 3. What did Spike do when he found the tie?
- 4. Try reading Max's lines with excitement and urgency!

#### After Reading

- 1. Can you retell how Max finally found his tie?
- 2. Why do you think Max was able to make it to the play on time?
- 3. Would you want a dog like Spike? Why or why not?
- 4. Skill mastery prompt: "Find and underline 5 'ie' words in the story!"
- 5. **Fluency Tip:** Try reading the story again like you're acting out a funny play!

#### **Activity Idea**

Draw a picture of Max's missing tie and design your own silly tie pattern. Write a sentence using at least three 'ie' words to describe what makes your tie special.

Encourage kids to read with expression—adding feelings makes the story more fun and helps with fluency!
