Before Reading

1. Remind them of the target skill: "Today we're looking for words that have the long A sound spelled with 'ay."

- 2. Have you ever had something blow away in the wind?
- 3. What do you think might happen when Max goes outside with his tray?

During Reading

- Sounding Out Support: Remind kids that the 'ay' spelling makes the long A sound like in "tray."
- 2. Watch for target skill words as you read!
- 3. Where did the tray slide first?
- 4. Read with a funny voice when Max calls after his tray!

After Reading

- 1. Can you retell how Max's tray got away and where it ended up?
- 2. Why do you think Max chose to eat inside next time?
- 3. What would you have done differently to keep the tray from blowing away?
- 4. Find and highlight 5 words with the 'ay' spelling.
- 5. **Fluency Tip:** Try reading the story again and make your voice sound surprised when Max yells, "Hey!"

Activity Idea

Draw a picture of the runaway tray and show the silly path it took. Add arrows to show where it went and write a short note about how Max found it. Then, share your drawing and tell the story in your own words!

Coaching Tip
