During Reading

- 1. **Sounding Out Support: Sounding Out Support:** Remind students that this version of "ou" makes the /oo/ sound like in *soup* and *you*.
- 2. Watch how the kids work together to sell their food.
- 3. What did they do to make the lunch plan work?
- 4. Fluency Tip: Read the final line with a proud and happy tone.

After Reading

- 2. Why do you think students liked the soup idea?
- 3. What would you write on a sign to get people to visit your table?
