What Does an Author Do?

An author is a person who writes books, poems, or articles. Authors use their ideas to teach, share stories, or make people laugh.

Before writing, an author often makes a plan. This helps them decide what to write about and who their readers will be.

Some authors write books about history or science. Others create fun adventures or poems that bring joy.

No matter what they write, authors help people learn and imagine new things through their words.

After reading the story, have your child point to and slowly sound out each practice word.

Before Reading
