What Are Collocations?

Collocations are natural word combinations that often appear together.

Native speakers use them without thinking.

Example: **make a decision** (not **x** do a decision).

Collocations make your English natural, fluent, and accurate.

Why Are Collocations Important in IELTS?

Show Show the examiner a wide lexical resource. Improve Improve fluency and naturalness. Help Help avoid repetition by using flexible word combinations. Boost Boost your band score in Speaking & Writing.

The 7 Main Types of Collocations



- 1. Adverb + Adjective
- 2. Adjective + Noun
- 3. Noun + Noun
- 4. Noun + Verb
- 5. Verb + Noun
- 6. Verb + Expression with Preposition
- 7. Verb + Adverb

Examples: Adverb + Adjective

She is **deeply concerned** about climate change. (Environment)

The results were **highly successful** in reducing poverty. (Society)



Examples: Adjective + Noun



He gave a **brief introduction** about his hometown. (Hometown)



Access to **higher education** is important for young people. (Education)





Examples: Noun + Noun

I spent the weekend reading a **history book**.
(Hobbies/Education)

Many families live in large **apartment buildings** in the city.
(Hometown)



Examples: Noun + Verb



The **data shows** an increase in internet use among students. (Education/Technology)



Her **stomach growled** because she skipped breakfast. (Food & Diet)



Examples: Verb + Noun

I usually **take notes** during my
English lessons.
(Education)

Families often
celebrate
festivals
together. (Family)



Examples: Verb + Expression with Preposition



I need to **focus on** improving my writing skills. (Education)



Many people **suffer from** stress in modern life. (Health)



Examples: Verb + Adverb

The teacher **speaks clearly** so everyone
can understand.
(Education)

He works hard to support his family. (Family)
