FORMAL VS INFORMAL VOCABULARY

WHY IT MATTERS

IELTS Writing Task 2 = formal.

IELTS Speaking = less formal but clear.

Wrong style lowers lexical resource.



EXAMPLES (1)

kids → children

lots of → many

okay --- acceptable



EXAMPLES (2)

Go up

• go up \rightarrow increase

Get

• get rid of \rightarrow eliminate

Say

say sorry → apologize



INFORMAL -> FORMAL SENTENCES

Informal: "Lots of kids go to school."

Formal: "Many children attend school."

Informal: "Somali food is nice."

Formal: "Traditional Somali cuisine is nutritious and culturally significant."



CONNECTORS

Informal: plus, so, anyways

Formal:
moreover,
therefore,
nevertheless



EXAMPLES

Informal: "Many people in Bosaso are nice."

Formal: "Residents of Bosaso are welcoming and hospitable."

Informal: "The climate is really bad."

Formal: "The climate conditions are severe and unpredictable."
