
WORKSHOP FORMAT: During workshops, the Public Garden is transformed into a field research site to consider the place of nature in our public monument landscape. Each participant chooses a tree in the Boston Public Garden and considers it on three registers:

(1) <u>on a scientific/objective/historical or quantitative register</u> (i.e., what knowledges does the tree hold? What is its history? What are its special properties? What are its uses? What makes it special as a tree?);

(2) <u>on an aesthetic or qualitative register (</u>i.e., how does this tree appear in culture, myths, literature, art, music)? How does it inspire?; and

(3) <u>on an ethical register</u>: (i.e., what ethical values does the tree hold? What ethical relationships bind us to it? How do we value nature in our ethical frameworks?

Participants are invited to submit a tangible contribution to the project as a result of their artistic research that will memorialize their ode to the tree.
