Shaun the Snowman isn't just your run-of-the-mill frosty fellow—he's the snowman you want to grab hot cocoa with, spill all your holiday secrets to, and maybe even make a snow angel next to. He's got charm, he's got style, and he's got a nose that would make Rudolph jealous.

Now, don't let those perfectly round little snowballs intimidate you. Shaun's not here to judge your stitches or your eggnog consumption. He's here for fun, frolic, and a little bit of festive flair on your mantle or under your tree. Whether you're crocheting in front of a roaring fire or binging every holiday movie ever made (yes, even the cheesy ones), Shaun will be your trusty companion.

So grab your yarn, your hook, and maybe a cookie (or five), and let's get started! And remember, in the immortal words of every snowman ever: chill out and enjoy the process!

SHAUN THE SMOWVHAN

Pattern:

Things you'll need:

- 6mm crochet hook
- 4mm crochet hook
- Chenille yarn (white, orange, brown and pink) or any yarn of your choice, make sure to use the correct size crochet hook that's recommended on your yarn's packaging
- Acrylic yarn any, this is for the scarf and beanie, choose one that will work with your 4mm hook
- a piece of cardboard
- dark brown pipe cleaner
- safety eyes (2 different sizes)
- yarn needle
- soft toy filling
- scissors

Body:

Starting with your white yarn

R1: 6sc in a magic ring (6)

R2: inc in all (12)

R3: (1 sc, 1 inc) repeat 6 times (18)

R4: (2sc, inc) repeat 6 times (24)

R5: (3sc, inc) repeat 6 times (30)

R6: sc in all BLO (30)

Cut out a round base from cardboard or plastic, this will help with evening out the base and your snowman will have better stability. Your base should be just a tiny bit smaller than your creation right now

R7: (4sc, inc) repeat 6 times (36)

R8-R10: sc in all (36)

R11: (4sc, dec) repeat 6 times (30)

R12: (3sc, dec) repeat 6 times (24)

R13: (2sc, dec) repeat 6 times (18)

Place 3 smaller safety eyes between R7 and R8, R9 and R10, R11 and R12. These will be your coal buttons. Ensure they all in line. Stuff your work with soft toy filling

R14: sc in all FLO (18)

R15: (2sc, inc) repeat 6 times (24)

R16: (3sc, inc) repeat 6 times (30)

R17-18: sc in all (30)

Place 2 smaller safety eyes between R16 and R17, R18 and R19. These will be your coal buttons. Make sure they all align with the first set too.

Abbreviations (US terms)

BLO - crochet in the back loop only

FLO - crochet in the front loop only

ch - chain

sc-single crochet

inc- two single crochets within the same

stitch

hdc-half double crochet

General instructions

- This pattern is worked in rounds
- Use a stitch marker to mark your first stitch every round
- Work all stitches in both loops unless otherwise instructed

SHAUN THE SMOWVHAN

Body:

Stuff the toy a bit more, than get the pipe cleaner and push it in from one side through the other between R17 and R18. Pay attention to keep it symmetrical and straight, leaving exactly the same length on both sides. Fold the ends back to form 3 fingers.

R19: (3sc, dec) repeat 6 times (24) R20: (2sc, dec) repeat 6 times (18) R21: (sc, dec) repeat 6 times (12)

Stuff the rest of the toy R22: sc in all FLO (12)

R23: (sc, inc) repeat 6 times (18) R24: (2sc, inc) repeat 6 times (24)

R25-26: sc in all (24)

Using the bigger safety eyes, place them between R25 and R26 about 6 stitches apart.

R27: (2sc, dec) repeat 6 times (18) R28: (sc, dec) repeat 6 times (12)

Stuff the rest of the snowman R29:dec in all (6) Close it off, and weave in the end

Features:

- Embroider the blush using a pink yarn between R24 and R25
- Embroider the smile using a brown yarn. Place it in the middle between the eyes.
- Still using a brown yarn embroider the eyebrows a row above the eyes
- Using an orange yarn chain 3, slip stitch into second chain from the hook, hdc into next one. Your nose is ready and it should be attached just above the smile between R24 and R25

Earl:

Using an acrylic yarn and your 4mm hook R1: chain 47

R2: hdc into second chain from your hook, hdc in all, at the end chain 1 and turn your work (46)

R3: hdc in all BLO, at the end chain 1 and turn your work (46)

R4: hdc in all BLO, at the end chain 1 and turn your work (46)

Now your scarf is ready to be wrapped around Shaun

Beanie:

Using an acrylic yarn and your 4mm hook

R1: Chain 10, hdc into the second chain from your hook, hdc in all till the end. At the end chain 1 and turn your work (9)

R2: hdc in BLO in all, at the en chain 1 an turn your work (9)

R3: keep repeating R2 until the piece is big enough to be wrapped around your snowman's head.

Once it's finished join the sides using slipstitch, then leave a tail of about 10 cm. Using the tail sew through the rim into all stitches and pull tight once you sewn through every stitch. Fasten it off and weave in the end



Well done, Shaun the Snowman is officially part of your frosty squad, and he's looking fabulous.
