Summer 2025 Program Timeline

April – May: Registration & Planning

- Students collaborate with **Debra & professionals** to prepare lesson plans.
- They choose **teaching subjects** (art, sports, music, English, etc.) and develop a schedule.

June 13-15: U.S. Student Arrivals

- Students **arrive in Oaxaca** and get settled.
- Early arrivals can **explore Oaxaca** (extra cost may apply).

June 16-20: Week 1 – Teaching & Community Service

• Students work with local children (Grades 3-6) on educational activities.

June 21-22: Enrichment Days

- Cultural excursions & activities for **students staying 2+ weeks**.
- New students arrive for Week 2; first-week students depart.

June 23-27: Week 2 – Teaching & Community Service

• Continued work with local children.

June 28-29: U.S. Student Departures

• Students return home unless continuing for Week 3 Cultural Stay.

June 30 – July 6: Week 3 – Cultural & Educational Stay

- Students participate in guided tours, workshops, and excursions.
- Parents & siblings are welcome to join (space permitting).
