About me

Born in 2000, Nathan Andrien is a young guitarist from Belgium. He started learning music at the age of 4 and has never stopped since then. Eager to learn, he was always curious and interested in discovering about music and the guitar itself.

In 2018, after spending a year in New-Zealand as an exchange student and having had a few small concert opportunities there, he joined the Royal Conservatory of Liège, Belgium in the class of Hughes Kolp and Adrien Brogna. There, he obtained a Master's degree in Pedagogy of the guitar and a Master's degree in classical guitar, 'soloist' specialization, with the Highest Honors. He also studied at the Franz Liszt Academy in Budapest, Hungary with Andras Csaki, and he's currently pursuing a Master of Music under Carlo Marchione's guidance at the Conservatorium Maastricht.

For the final research work of his Master's degree in Liège, he managed and coordinated a collaboration between the Composition Department of the Franz Liszt Academy of Budapest and the Composition Department of the Royal Conservatory of Liège. The objective was to allow the creation of 4 new pieces of chamber music (2 from each Department), written by composition students, which include classical guitar. The collaboration was completed by a concert in each school as well as by the organization of a trip for composition students with an Erasmus scholarship to supervise the performance of their pieces in the other's school.

Apart from this interest in the creation of living composers' work, he also has a deep love for the colours and the unique tone of the classical guitar, and he's always looking for opportunities to share his thoughts and feelings about the more classical guitar repertoire to the audiences.

He regularly has the opportunity to perform in solo, duo or with an ensemble in Belgium and France, and he enjoyed masterclasses with international classical guitar figures such as Manuel Barrueco, Marcin Dylla, Judicaël Perroy, Aniello Desiderio, Pablo Marquez, Gabriel Bianco...

Some other projects include concerts and CD recordings with a plucked strings ensemble directed by famous French mandolinist Vincent Beer-Demander and working with different artists (singer, saxophone...)

Another aspect of his personality as a musician is his will to introduce the classical guitar to a broader audience. He's working on transcriptions for guitar solo and duo, offering a different aspect of famous repertoire through the light and delicate touch of his instrument. He's currently working on works from Chopin, Rameau, Franck,... and already performs some of his transcriptions in concert with his guitar duo (J.P. Rameau - 'Les Sauvages'; Chopin - Prélude n° 2, 6, 20).
