WHAT IS PHONEMIC AWARENESS



It's sound play!

Children listen to sounds, clap them, tap them, and say them

— no letters needed.

Just sounds. Just movement.

Just fun!



WHY IT MATTERS



- Builds strong listening and attention skills
- Gets children ready to read and spell
- Helps them hear beginning, middle, and ending sounds
- Easy to do anywhere no materials needed!



10 HOP SOUND-PLAY ACTIVITIES




1. Sound Clap

Say a word slowly. Children clap once for each sound.



2. Sound Hop

Place two or three floor spots or papers. Children hop one hop per soundjust like a rabbit!



3. Robot Talk

Say word sounds like a robot: "/c/.../a/.../p/".
Children blend: cap.



4. I Spy a Sound

"I spy something that starts with /s/." Children find an object with that sound.



5. Tap the Sounds

Tap the table (or your knees) once per sound in a word.

Example: $dog \rightarrow tap-tap-tap$.




6. Sound Freeze

Say a sound. When children hear the target sound, they freeze. For other sounds, they move or dance.



7. Sound Stretch

Stretch hands apart as you stretch the sounds: "/c/.../a/.../t/". Children say the word: cat.



8. Odd One Out

Say three words: "sun – sock – duck". Children choose the one with a different beginning sound.



9. CopyCat

Make a sound and exaggerate the mouth shape. Children copy the mouth and repeat the sound -just like a copycat!



10.Sound Echo

Say a sound: "/t/".
Children echo it back in a fun voice: robot, tiny mouse, giant, underwater, etc.

★ How to Use This Resource

- Try one activity for a few days, or follow the child's interest.
- Keep it short and playful.
- Start with beginning sounds.
- No letters needed -only listening and moving.

★ Quick-Start Routine

- 1.Listen Hear the sounds.
- 2. Move Clap, hop, or tap them.
- 3. Blend Say the whole word.
- 4. Respond "You just played with sounds!"
