- 1) Apologies for Absence; Albert Jamieson, Melanie Frobisher Debi Hallett,
- 2) Approval of Minutes of Meeting No 41 V1; Approved
- 3) **Draft Code of Conduct;** Agreed to be reviewed before the AGM (due June)
- 4) Declaration of personal interest in topics to be discussed; none.
- 5) Assignment of Responsibilities; the draft of members responsibilities (attached) was considered and in general considered OK. Minor modifications are needed before it is published on the website, and this will be done when the website is reestablished.
- 6) **Financial Report**: Fred presented the accounts. There are no more funds, it being the end of the financial year, remaining funds being returned to Locality. We are not able to claim any more grants from Locality as our Plan is now 'made'.

- b) School Tree Planting. Tree planting at St Cuthberts School was successful. We need to build on this-Melanie to issue a press release as soon as possible when the photos of the planting are issued by the School.
- New Trees project. Mike will liaise with the new group planting wild flowers to see if we can progress hedgerows and trees along roadsides through them.
   Mike will produce a scope of works for the remaining greening projects and then we will approach them and see if we can work together.

- f) Refurbishment of Public Footpath in Bagshot Road (opposite Fletcher's Garage) running down to Blays Lane. Considered to be of secondary importance for now.

Melanie Frobisher, Membership, Publicity and Press, responsible for maintaining and growing membership and communications to and from members, publicity (web site and Facebook), publicity and press articles on our activities.

### NOTE TO EGVNPF STEERING COMMITTEE APRIL 11TH, 2024

#### AGENDA ITEM - PARKING AND SPEED LIMITS PROJECTS

Update further to the March meeting note, mainly for awareness, the governance of agreeing to the Parking Review objection wording dealt with by prior email.

**PARKING**; Actions from previous meetings are now all completed, possible access to the c.46K from RH s106 being pursued (slowly) through Cllr Marisa Heath – may be able to intercept her at the surgeries on April 13<sup>th</sup>. Two further PPP coordinating meetings have taken place focused on delivering Phase 1 - Problem Definition and Situational Factors; and is on track for making submissions to the SCC Runnymede Parking Review Englefield Green 2024/25 (Inputs Stage 1) by the deadline of Nov 29<sup>th</sup> 2024. Some interesting critique of the council's survey commissions of the past 15y is emerging from one of the group, and amongst the list of Situational Factors some surprising discussions on the part the proliferation of drop-kerbs has on robbing roads of their on-street parking.

Responses to the Objections to the SCC Runnymede Parking Review Englefield Green 2023/24 (Advertising and Objections Stage 3) are awaited.

Updating the Project Centre Ltd. 2021 report – they have submitted a preliminary draft proposal for the measurement and observation work. This is merely a "strawman" starting point for on passing to the councillors to help the process along including sourcing money to pay for it (see above)! This has been passed on to Cllrs Heath, Berardi and Gates as a first step – Heath is the key one as it is a SCC issue.

With our website having been offline no communique on the PPP has been sent to members but this is still planned.

**SPEED LIMITS;** In the coming months our focus will be on following up on our SCC Vision Zero submissions on our 4 areas of interest (Priest Hill, St Jude's, Prune Hill and A30) with more detailed submissions. These have to dovetail with our NP and Placemaking Report, SCC LTP4 and SCC LCWIP and their RBC derivatives, over 500 pages of bureaucracy. This research is time consuming but necessary.

As an example, the A30 from Virginia Water to the Egham/Staines roundabout is No. 1 on the list of the county's high priority projects in the LCWIP. This was formulated in 2021 with a 10y horizon and we may already have missed the first round of inputs to it, so how we engage with them from now on is being explored as it goes into a Feasibility Study phase.

Meeting about RH cycle track parallel to A30 being arranged for in term time.

I had replies from both school heads and have subsequently secured an exploratory meeting with only St Cuthbert's next week about the possibility of 20MPH zones.

Various issues per above to be raised at Councillors surgeries April 13th.
