

BAPTISM IN BLOOD

The Church born from the blood of Christ grew up through the sufferings and death of martyrs. The present story starts with the stoning of Stephen, the first martyr and ends with the violent death of Apostle James. Acts 7-12 is the basis for this story.

Initially the Church was taken for a reformist group or a protestant fraction of the Jewish religion. It took time even for the disciples to

grasp the depth and breadth of the definitive intervention of God in human history through Jesus Christ. The Apostles were aware of the universal mission entrusted to them by the Risen Lord; still for almost six years they lingered in and around Jerusalem. It was the persecution that forced them out. The Holy Spirit was pushing them farther and farther away from the religious capital of Judaism. Wherever they went, they proclaimed the Good News.

The deacons were elected to look after the material affairs of the Church. However, in the course of time, they also became full time evangelizers because they firmly believed that when the Word of God fully transforms the human hearts, a just society will take shape and then there will be no need of anybody supervising the distribution of food and clothing. The examples of Stephen and Philip, the deacons, show that preaching the gospel is the primary task of every Christian.

The conversion of Saul marked a turning point in the history of the Church. The Damascus experience was a dramatic call from God. The encounter with the risen Christ revealed to him that the crucified Jesus lives and suffers in the Church. This new awareness transformed the bitter enemy of the Church into a zealous missionary of Christ. The experience of Paul and innumerable other disciples proclaim that Jesus Christ is not a person dead and gone but the Lord who lives and works in the world.

The conversion of Cornelius, the Roman centurion, marked another turning point in the history of evangelization. Philip had preached to the Samaritans and to a gentile (the Ethiopian eunuch) on the way. But, Peter went into the house of a non Jew, proclaimed the Gospel, and baptized the family. It was God himself who prepared Peter for this new step by revealing to him that God loves all peoples without the distinction of caste or race. However, the questions raised by the Jerusalem Church against Peter's action demonstrate how difficult it was for a Jewish Christian Church to grasp the implications of that vision. It was almost twenty years after the Pentecost that the Church finally obtained clarity about the place of Jews and non Jews in the Church.

It is through the people who are open to the Spirit that evangelization takes place in its true sense. No one who follows the footsteps of the Lord can escape suffering and persecution. This very suffering is the source of strength for the

Christians to proclaim the Gospel. Those who have received the Baptism in water and Spirit must be ready for the Baptism in blood as well, in order to follow Jesus who poured out his blood for us.









The Jewish leaders arrested Stephen and brought him before the Sanhedrin.





