Only after long years of hard work, slavery and imprisonment was Joseph liberated. This time he was exalted beyond every expectation. He was raised to a position he had never dreamt of.







Joseph, it is a gift for your seventeenth birthday gift. It's made in Egypt.









































































Jacob blessed Joseph's sons, Manasseh and Ephraim. When he died his remains were to take back to Canaan.
