## JOSHUA

Joshua is the hero who led the people of Israel in the conquest of Canaan. Though many had set out from Egypt under Moses only two of them, Joshua and Caleb, who remained faithful to Yahweh all through the journey, could enter the Promised Land.

In the life of Joshua three events stand out: the conquest of the land, the division of the land among the twelve tribes and the covenant as Shechem. The events narrated here took place in the second half of the thirteenth Century B.C. The present story is based on the Book of Joshua, a book of the Bible, written

sometime in the sixth century B.C. At that time the people of Israel was in the Babylonian captivity.

The Book of Joshua depicts a very dramatic picture of the conquest. It gives the impression of an unending series of victories. But, one should not forget the fact that these narratives took shape six centuries after the actual events. The Bible sees the battles of Joshua as the battle of Yahweh who was decided to give an oppressed and landless people a land of their own.

Joshua could not capture the whole of Canaan, as the book itself admits (Jos 13,1). Only after two centuries, under King David, could Israel conquer the whole land. The sacred author writing after centuries attributed much of David's victories to Joshua. The God who liberated them once would lead them again from captivity to the Promised Land. It was to instill this hope in the people that the Book of Joshua was written. Besides, he wanted to teach them that the misery they were subjected to was due to their own infidelity to Yahweh.

The violent destruction of towns as well as the brutal massacre of people raises many questions, especially because they are said to be ordered by Yahweh. If God is the God of all, then why is it that he shows partiality to one particular people? Here we have to distinguish between historical facts and their biblical interpretation. The Israelites who settled down in Canaan mingled with the people of the land, adopting their customs and accepting their religious practices. Thus, gradually they turned away from Yahweh, becoming unfaithful. This should not have taken place, argued the sacred writer. This belief is reflected in the command to exterminate the Canaanites, a command that probably was neither given nor executed.


Joshua divided the land among the twelve tribes. No tribe was considered inferior or superior to another one. All the families of Israel had equal rights in the Promised Land. Only the tribe of Levi, dedicated to priestly service, had no claim on the land. They were to be supported by the other tribes.

The recently discovered "El-Amarna letters" give important insights into the history of Joshua's conquests. Some of these letters were written by the Canaanite kings to their sovereign, the Pharaoh, requesting his help against the farmers in revolt. It seems that when Joshua entered Canaan the whole land was rocked by revolutionary wars. It is quite probable that the peasants of the land, rejecting the rule and religion of the kings, joined the Israelites and accepted Yahweh, the God of the oppressed, as their God. The covenant at Shechem established the communion of this new people.


The name Joshua means, "Yahweh saves". "Jesus" is the Greek form of his Hebrew name. Joshua who led the Israelites into Canaan is the prototype of Jesus who leads the whole humanity into the Kingdom of God, the true Promised Land.

Moses died on the threshold of the Promised Land. The task of leading the people to Canaan was entrusted to Joshua who was always faithful to Yahweh. The Israelite army was encamped in Shithim, on the west bank of Jordan, Joshua speaking to the people...


Brothers, the Promised Land lies across the river. We must fight for it. Let us not repeat the rebellion of 'Kadesh Bernea'.































## The enemies were scattered. Israel captured the town and fortresses.
