In this book we are depicting the period that lies between Jesus' return from Egypt and the beginning of his public ministry. The Gospels give us information about his life in Nazareth except the fact that he grew up in Nazareth as an obedient boy, he was loved by all and that he worked as a carpenter. He lived as an ordinary man, earning his bread by the sweat of his brow. Such a life

has no place in the world history that records the triumphs of heroes.

The event in the temple at the age of twelve stands out as an exception to this obscurity. The setting in which present that event is based on historical context of the period. By staying back in the temple and then responding to his parents as he did, Jesus reveals his unique relationship to God and his firm determination to do the will of his Father. The finding of Jesus in the Temple on the

third day foreshadows the Paschal event that turns Sorrow into joy.

John the Baptist was the Herald sent to announce the coming of Messiah and to prepare the people to receive him. The Gospels tell us that until receiving the prophetic call John was in the desert. His association with the Qumran community depicted in this story is plausible because of the similarity and differences between John and the desert community. attire reminded one of Elijah and his words

were like those of the authentic prophets of the Old Testament.


John's message was an urgent call to conversion. He proclaimed that God was angry with the world and was about to punish the sinful humanity. Only a true change of heart and life could save the world from impending disaster. The Messiah, he said, was coming after him to purify the world with fire. Everybody without exception was a sinner before God and stood in need of conversion. The

Baptism he administered was a sign of admitting one's sinfulness and need of redemption.

Together with the common people Jesus came and was Baptized by John. Though he was sinless, by submitting to the Baptism, Jesus expressed his solidarity with the sinful humanity. He took upon himself the sins of the world in order to liberate the world from its sins.

With the appearance of the Lord on the scene, the task of the Herald is accomplished. When he challenged the ruler of Galilee, with his call to conversion, John was signing his own death warrant. The first wife whom Herod Antipas divorced in order to marry Herodias, was the daughter of Aretas, king of the neighboring Nabataea. Aretas was preparing for war to avenge this insult when John started his violent accusations. Herod

feared that this would raise popular revolt in that critical moment. Instead of changing his ways, Herod chose to silence the accusing voice. Thus, John became the Herald not only announcing the coming, but also prefiguring the outcome of Jesus' ministry.
