

## The prophet

All the four Gospels narrate the public life of Jesus that starts with the baptism and ends with the passion, death and resurrection. While the Gospels agree in reporting the beginning and the end the ministry, they differ considerably among themselves as far as the sequence of events is concerned. It is therefore difficult to depict the life of Jesus in a chronological order. In the present series we are mainly following the Gospel of Mark, supposed to be the most ancient one. Materials from other Gospels are incorporated in this historical frame work. The present story depicts of Jesus' ministry which includes the temptation in the desert, the call of the first disciples, the miracle at Cana and Capernaum and the proclamation at Nazareth.

Prophet is a person called by God, anointed by the Holy Spirit and sent out to proclaim the word of God. By the middle of the fifth century B.C. the age of the Old Testament prophets came to an end. However, the people of Israel believed that at the end of time God would again send a

prophet like Moses in order to liberate them from slavery and to inaugurate the age of salvation. This belief was supported by many of the O.T. prophecies. The Nazareth episode in the Gospel of Luke presents Jesus as such a prophet. The prophecy of Isaiah(61,1-2) is quoted as the programme of Jesus' ministry. The controversy and the rejection that followed the proclamation point to the violent death to which his ministry will lead him.

Poverty and hunger, exploitation and oppression, sickness and death are all various


forms of slavery from which humanity needs liberation. But the root cause of all these, according to the Bible, is sin. Through sin mankind and the whole world became enslaved to Satan, the power of evil. The temptations reported by all the Gospels depict how Jesus defeated the power of evil by choosing to follow the will of God rather than worldly power and glory. The miracles of healing and exorcism are visible manifestations of his victory and the realization of the program announced at Nazareth.

The changing of water into wine at Cana was understood by the early Church as a symbol of the Sacraments, especially Baptism and Eucharist, through which Jesus liberates us from the slavery of sin and gives us Divine life. The miraculous draught of fish was a sign of that the fishermen of Capernaum could easily understand. When Jesus called them to be his disciples, with great joy they abandoned everything and followed him.


By the Sacraments of Baptism and confirmation, all the followers of Jesus are


entrusted with a prophetic mission. The Holy Spirit strengthens them to resist temptations and to proclaim the Good News of liberation. The prophetic mission demands that one be totally faithful to the Word of God and be prepared to meet with rejection and persecution.


After receiving Baptism from John, Jesus was led by the Holy Spirit into the desert.




He spent forty days in the desert without any food and prayed ardently to discern the will of the Father, concerning his mission.













Jesus recalled the suffering of his people and the interventions of God in their favor.


























































## The people in the Synagogue became furious and took him out of the city.
