

The Liberator

Today, more than ever, People are looking to Jesus as the liberator of mankind. But in defining the nature of liberation, there exists a variety of opinions. Some emphasize the sociopolitical liberation while others restrict it entirely to the spiritual sphere, as liberation of the souls from sin. In the present story we are depicting a few

episodes that highlight the various aspects of liberation.

In the programmatic episode of Nazareth, Jesus announced that he was sent to proclaim the Good News of liberation to the oppressed. His subsequent ministry is the fulfillment of that programme. Hence in order to understand the nature of liberation Jesus proclaimed, we have to see what he did and taught and how he responded to the expectation of the people.

Among the contemporaries of Jesus, there existed various views about liberation and about the ways and means of achieving it. As Palestine was under Roman rule a political liberation foremost in the mind of the Jews. There were many revolutionary groups in Palestine, especially in Galilee. They wanted to throw out the Romans by armed revolt. A Guerilla group known as Zealots that is believed to have originated in A.D. 6 with Judas the Galilean as its leader was the

most important among them. Barabbas and the two thieves crucified with Jesus probably belonged to that group. Some of the apostles of Jesus had affinity with them and one named Simon is explicitly identified as a Zealot. However, Jesus neither shared their aspirations nor approved of their violent methods.

The Liberation Jesus proclaimed concerned the whole person and the whole world. He did not make a distinction between the Israelites and the Gentiles,

between Zealots and Romans. In the eyes of Jesus the world was under the dominion of evil that manifested itself as oppression, foreign dominion, alienation, sickness and death. Hence he started his ministry striking at the root of evil, namely sin and Satan. The various healing and exorcising activities of Jesus have to be understood as liberation from evil.

The Sinai Covenant and the laws were given to Israel in order to guarantee freedom to all. But as interpreted and

enforced by the religious leaders, these very laws became an enslaving force. Sabbath was meant to give rest to those who work, but it turned out to be an unbearable burden to the people. The Laws concerning cleanliness were intended to emphasize the need of being holy in body and soul. However, in the course of time these became the basis of discrimination. The majority of the people were branded as unclean by birth (pagans, Samaritans),

health (handicapped, Lepers, possessed), profession (tax collectors, shepherds) etc.

By Casting out demons, healing the sick, associating himself with outcasts and forgiving sins, Jesus set them free and restored them the dignity of the children of God. He placed human beings over the laws and explained that laws were meant to guarantee freedom and not slavery.

While liberating the people from various forms of slavery, Jesus called the

individuals and the entire nation to a radical conversion. The Samaritan woman must forsake her sinful past; the publican must renounce his greed and share his goods with the poor. In order to enter the kingdom of God, everybody must believe in Jesus Christ, turn away from the evil ways and dedicate themselves entirely to the service of God. True freedom can be obtained only through a radical change of heart, leading to creation of a new society based on love that knows no limits.


































The Pharisees and lawyers walked out in rage and conspired against Jesus.
