

## THE ONE TO COME

The people of Israel believed that God would send them a Redeemer. For centuries they waited for him in constant prayer and ardent expectation, basing their hopes on the Old Testament prophecies. However, opinions differed as to the nature and activity of this awaited Redeemer. Many believed that a king from the descendants of David would come and establish an empire with Jerusalem as its capital. This king was called the Christ, meaning the one who received the royal anointing. Others waited for a prophet like Moses to come and liberate them from foreign domination. Still others expected that the great prophet Elijah himself would come to call the people to repentance, after which God would come to judge the world with fire.

John the Baptist had depicted the One to Come as the judge. Obviously he was referring to Jesus of Nazareth. But, Jesus' preaching and healing ministry did not exactly correspond to John's proclamations. Jesus was offering forgiveness and salvation to all, and repeatedly

saying that he had come not to judge and to condemn, but to liberate and to save. Hence it was not quite clear if Jesus was the One to Come.

Jesus did not fulfill all the expectations of the people. He was neither a political leader nor a mighty warrior. He called people to conversion and unconditional obedience to the will of God, manifested through his preaching. But the Jewish leaders, refusing to be converted, rejected him and plotted against him. At this juncture, Jesus chose the twelve apostles who were to be the foundation stones of the church that was to be the

true Israel. This was a turning point in the history of salvation and the decision was an extremely serious one. Jesus spent long time in prayer before making the decision.

Accompanied by the apostles, Jesus explained to the people the nature of the Kingdom of God and the conditions for entering it. God is offering his liberating love gratuitously and each one should accept it unconditionally. In response to God's love, everyone should love his neighbor, even the enemies. Love should become manifest in helping those in need without expecting anything in return, in forgiving offences and in being merciful to all.

Jesus' words and deeds are his credentials, and each one is called upon to make a decision for himself by accepting or rejecting Jesus as the One to Come. The good news proclaimed to the poor has become manifest as health to the sick, forgiveness to sinners, acceptance to the outcasts, and life to the dead. Those who accept Jesus will have eternal life and will be raised from the dead on the last day, never to die again.

The poor and the simple rejoiced at this message and received Jesus whole-heartedly, whereas the rich and the powerful as well as the religious leaders did not understand or accept him. Persisting in their ignorance they continued to search for ways and means to eliminate him. Only those who are aware of their own sinfulness can welcome the Redeemer. Only the poor and the simple can accept Jesus as the Savior.




