

THE SON OF GOD

The first half of Jesus' public life was spent mostly in Galilee. Thousands of people gathered around him even from neighbouring countries, in order to listen to his words and to be healed of various ailments. Jesus cured them all and spoke to them about the Kingdom of God. At a later stage, the apostles also participated in the preaching and healing ministry. Jesus' reputation spread far and wide, drawing ever greater crowds to him.

Apparently this first part of the ministry was very successful and is often called the "Galilean spring". However, the faith of the crowds was very shallow.

Most of those who gathered around Jesus were not willing to change their lives. All that they wanted was healing and bread. When Jesus invited them to conversion and to deeper faith the vast majority of them decided to leave him. The very people who tried to make him king when he fed them

miraculously with bread in the desert, considered him to be insane when he spoke about the bread of eternal life. Towns and villages, one after another, closed their doors against Jesus. Capernaum and Bethsaida, where he had performed many miracles, turned a deaf ear to his call to conversion.

Not only the general public, but even his disciples took offence at some of his teachings and were scandalized by his claims. When pressed to make a choice, many

decided to go away from him. Herod the local ruler who was haunted by the guilt of murdering the Baptist and of many other crimes, considered Jesus a threat to his security and wanted to kill him. The religious leaders became more aggressive and continually tried to alienate the people from Jesus. Thus the Galilean ministry apparently ended up in failure. This is usually called the "Galilean crisis".

In the midst of this crisis two events stand out, namely the confession of Peter and the transfiguration. In answer to Jesus' question, Peter as the representative of the apostles, confessed his faith that Jesus is Christ, the Son of God. This is the faith of the Church. Jesus accepted the confession and declared that Peter could come to this faith only through a special revelation from God. However, this needed further deepening which would come only through the passion

and death of Christ. From now on Jesus will concentrate on teaching the apostles about the necessity of his suffering, and thus prepare them for the impending events in Jerusalem.

The transfiguration on the mountain confirms Peter's confession and gives a glimpse of the true identity of Jesus as the Son of God. On the mountain, as at the baptism in Jordan, God himself declared Jesus as the Beloved Son. The voice from heaven


commanded the chosen three to listen to Jesus' teaching and to follow him on the way of the cross. The presence of Moses and Elijah, representing the entire OT, bears witness to the fact that the history of salvation is being fulfilled in Jesus and that this fulfillment will involve his suffering and death in Jerusalem.






























































The activities of the Apostles created a big commotion in Galilee. Herod also heard about it.











































































They started the journey to Jerusalem. Six days later Jesus took with him Peter, James, and John and went to the Mountain to pray.
