

SON OF MAN

The Son of God, taking upon himself all our suffering and sorrows manifested God's infinite love for us. Even though he is the Lord of the Universe, he lived upon the earth as the poorest among the poor. He identified himself with the homeless by being born in a manger. He spent his childhood as a refugee in Egypt. As a young man he earned his bread by hard work expressing his solidarity with all the workers in the world. Thus, he taught the dignity of honest human labour. During his public ministry he had nowhere to lay his head. As if to emphasize that he is man in the full sense of the term, he called himself "Son of Man", which has the same meaning as "man".

The Son of God became Son of Man, yet he possessed all the power and authority of God. He has the power to forgive sins and is the master of all the laws, including the law of Sabbath. At the same time, he lived like a servant and offered himself up in sacrifice for the liberation of mankind from sin. The title Son of Man denotes the weakness as well as the glory of the Son of God incarnate. It is the same Son of Man who lived on earth as the servant of all, was rejected, persecuted and brutally put to death that will come at the end of the world as the judge. In Jesus the prophecy of Daniel concerning the glorified Son of Man is fulfilled. In the present story, a

few episodes are narrated that depict Jesus as the suffering Son of Man and illustrate his teaching on the necessity of following him on the path of suffering.

During the second half of the public ministry Jesus concentrated on teaching the apostles about his passion and death as the way fixed by God for him to tread. Again and again he spoke to them about the impending suffering and the violent death and also about the glorious resurrection that will

follow. But the apostles could not understand or accept it.

Through parables and symbolic actions he instructed them constantly about humble service and selfless love. With child like simplicity and faith they must always pray to the heavenly Father. The greatness of a person is to be measured by his humility and the selfless service he renders to those in need. The Jews considered only the fellow Jews as their neighbours and taught it obligatory to love and help those who belonged to their race. But Jesus demanded from his disciples a love that knows no such limits. He taught that anybody in need of their help should be considered a neighbor.

It is not enough to say that one loves. Love should be manifested in concrete deeds of selfless service and generous help. The one who does not come to the aid of those in need is a hypocrite. The disciples of Jesus should not imitate the Jewish leaders who

boasted of their virtues, of their strict observance of the law and paraded their acts of piety in public without bothering to help the needy. This kind of piety and religiosity are mere hypocrisy, which the disciples must carefully avoid.

Those who believe in Jesus and obey his words have nothing to fear. They can face even death with joy because they put their trust in God who can raise the dead to life. Jesus himself is the model of undying hope

and unflinching courage that derive from a total trust in the love of the Father. Nothing could deviate him from fulfilling the mission entrusted by the Father, neither the advice of friends nor the threats of those in authority. The way of the Son of Man leads to glory through suffering and death and all those who follow him on this way can be sure of participating with him in his glory.


